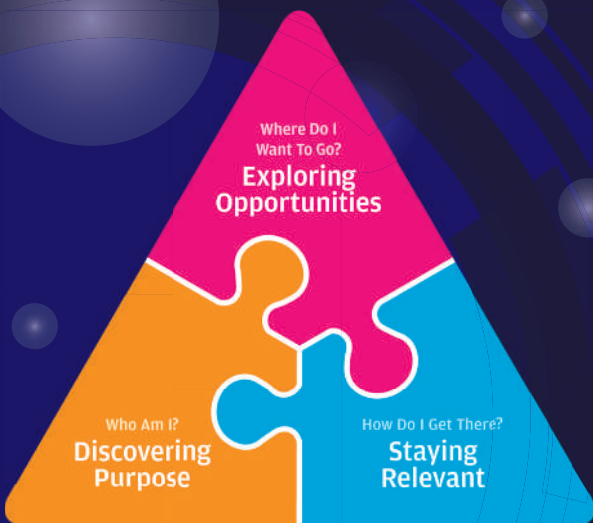

EXPLORING OPPORTUNITIES - WHERE DO I WANT TO GO?

There are many education pathways I can confidently explore that align with my strengths and interests.

Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB)

Full Subject-Based Banding (Full SBB) gives you greater flexibility to customise your learning by taking subjects at different levels based on your strengths, interests and learning needs.

As you progress through secondary school, you will have opportunities to take your respective subjects at a more demanding or less demanding level. Beyond the four PSLE subjects, eligible students can also offer Humanities subjects at a more demanding level from Secondary 2.

As students will offer a more diverse combination of subjects at different subject levels arising from Full SBB, MOE has reviewed the admissions criteria for post-secondary pathways to provide more options for different learner profiles, while ensuring that you continue to have the fundamentals to thrive in your chosen pathway.
